ARTICLE A203 GENERAL RULES -- INDIVIDUAL SPORT LICENSES

1. All individual Sport License holders, ~~except individuals residing outside Canada, must be members of Equine Canada and provide proof of and maintain an approved third party Personal Liability and Property Damage (PL&PD) insurance policy. (See Glossary definition: Personal Liability and Property Damage insurance):~~ residing in a Participating Province must purchase a membership from that PPSO.

ARTICLE A205 INDIVIDUAL GOLD SPORT LICENSES

An individual holding a valid Gold Sport License is eligible to:

- ~~6. To purchase a Sport License, an individual must be a member of Equine Canada and must provide proof of and maintain an approved third party PL&PD insurance policy.~~

ARTICLE A206 INDIVIDUAL SILVER SPORT LICENSES

An individual holding a valid Silver Sport License is eligible to:

- ~~6. To purchase a Sport License, an individual must be a member of Equine Canada and must provide proof of and maintain an approved third party PL&PD insurance policy.~~
- ~~7. Apply to be an Equine Canada certified Instructor of Beginners.~~

ARTICLE A207 INDIVIDUAL BRONZE SPORT LICENSES

An individual holding a valid Bronze Sport License is eligible to:

- ~~6. To purchase a Sport License, an individual must be a member of Equine Canada and must provide proof of and maintain an approved third party PL&PD insurance policy.~~

ARTICLE A208 TEMPORARY SPORT LICENSE

8. To purchase a Temporary Sport License, an individual must be a member of Equine Canada, and for those residing in a participating province, a member of that PPSO.

ARTICLE A209 LIFETIME SPORT LICENSES

1. Individuals who were issued CEF life memberships prior to 1998 are considered to hold a lifetime Sport License.
2. Individual Lifetime Sport License holders wishing to compete in EC-sanctioned competitions and residing in a Participating Province must maintain an approved third party PL&PD insurance policy be a member of that PPSO. See A203.

ARTICLE A1302 GENERAL RULES PERTAINING TO OFFICIALS

2. All EC-licensed officials must hold a valid Gold Sport License and be in good standing. Officials from another country, for whom a guest card has been granted, must be members in good standing of their own national federation. Officials who fail to maintain valid EC Sport Licenses and their status as recognized officials as stipulated in Article A1305, Maintaining Recognized Status, will be removed from the EC official's directory.

For Canadian FEI-licensed officials, see Article A1334.

ARTICLE A1334 FEI OFFICIALS

6. For Veterinarians, Stewards and in disciplines where there are no EC officials programs, Canadian FEI officials will be required to pay the required annual EC Sport License fee as in Article A1334.2.
